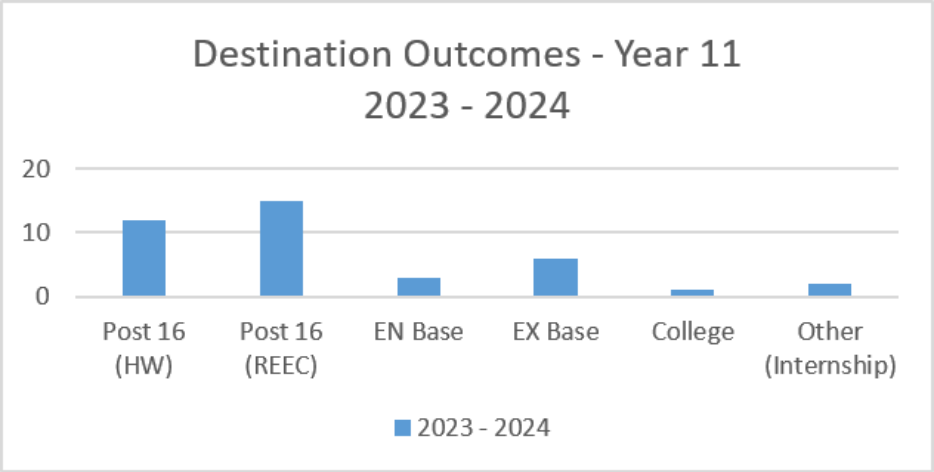




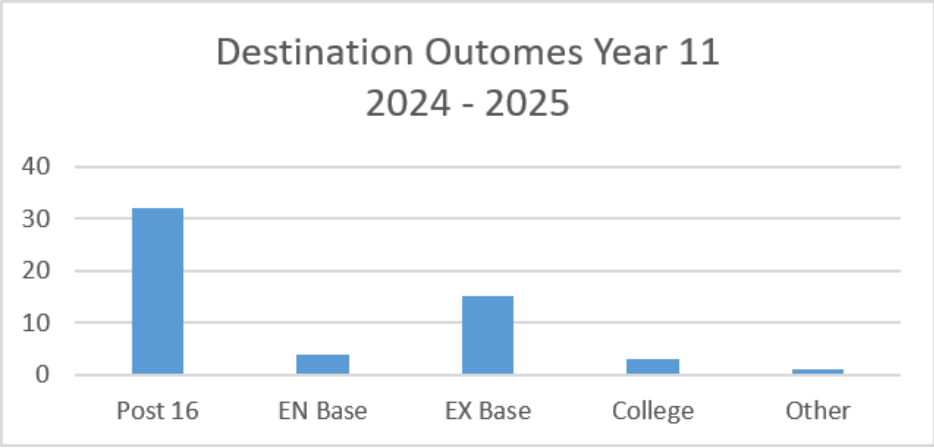

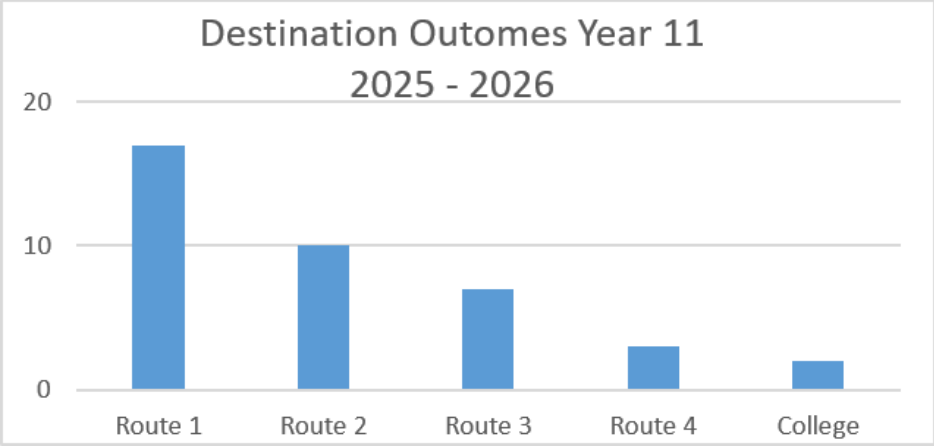
Destinations Data - Year 11



Year 11 Destination Outcomes (2023-2024): Most students progressed into Post-16 education, particularly through REEC pathways, while smaller numbers moved into employment-related programmes, college, and alternative destinations.

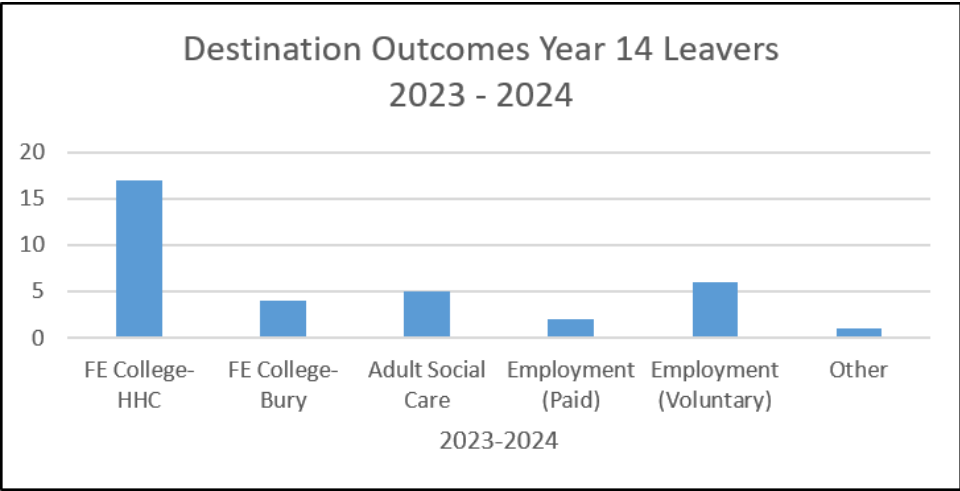


Year 11 Destination Outcomes (2024-2025): Most students progressed to Post-16 education, while a substantial proportion moved into external specialist provision. Smaller numbers accessed college, engagement-based programmes, and other destinations.

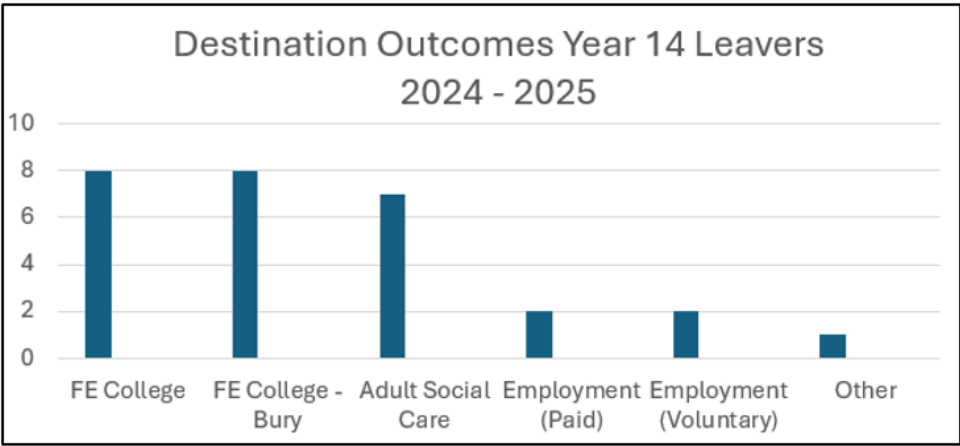


Year 11 Destination Outcomes (2025-2026): Most students progressed to Route 1 destinations, while others accessed Routes 2 and 3 according to individual needs and aspirations. Smaller numbers transitioned to Route 4 provision and college placements.

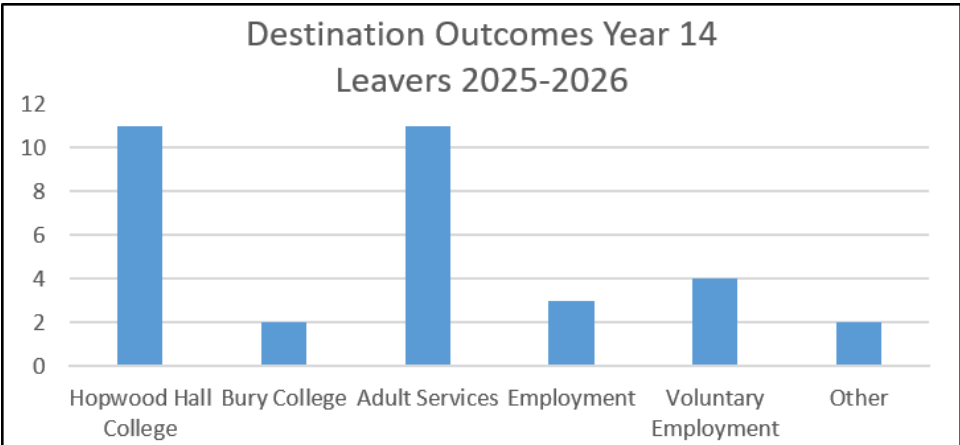
Destinations Data - Year 14



Year 14 Destination Outcomes (2023-2024): Most Year 14 leavers continued into further education, particularly at Hopwood Hall College. Smaller numbers transitioned into adult social care services, paid employment, voluntary employment, and other individual destinations.



Year 14 Destination Outcomes (2024-2025): Most Year 14 leavers progressed into further education, either at general FE colleges or specialist provision in Bury. A significant number also transitioned into adult social care, while smaller numbers secured paid employment, voluntary roles, and other destinations.



Year 14 Destination Outcomes (2025-2026): The majority of Year 14 leavers progressed to Hopwood Hall College and Adult Services, reflecting a diverse range of onward pathways tailored to individual needs. Smaller numbers moved into employment, voluntary work, further education in Bury, and other destinations.

Real Work Programme Destinations

Overall outcomes over the past 12 years. Out of 102 learners on the Real Work Programme:

- 49 Learners have gained paid employment (48%)
- 21 Learners have gained voluntary employment (21%)
- 70 out of 102 learners therefore went into employment (69%)
- 24 learners went onto further education (24%)
- 92% of interns transitioned into employment or college

The Real Work Programme has consistently delivered strong outcomes between 2013 and 2026, with 69% of learners progressing into employment and 24% continuing into further education. Of the 102 learners who completed the programme, 49 (48%) secured paid employment and 21 (21%) moved into voluntary employment, meaning that 92% progressed into either employment or college. The 2025-2026 cohort reflects this ongoing success, with 54% of learners entering employment (23% paid and 31% voluntary), 39% progressing to college, and 7% moving into other pathways, demonstrating the programme's continued effectiveness in supporting positive post-school destinations.

- 33% increase this year in interns achieving paid employment.
- 54% of interns in employment
- There was a 233% increase in the number of learners taking up a Supported Internship at Redwood for 2025/2026
