

REEC ICT

The main focus is for students to learn to use ICT in a functional manner to prepare them for employment. Students learn to use technology safely as a tool to communicate in a professional manner and to create functional documents for given audiences whilst working towards a BTEC qualification. Students also learn to use technology effectively to support learning across the curriculum and to complete independent research.



Students learn productive office skills to enable them to be able to complete ICT tasks with independence and efficiency and learn to self-check work for accuracy.

The ICT and Computing curriculum is designed to be fun and engaging whilst teaching students the skills they will need in the future.




During LOTC sessions, students practice a variety of functional skills, including using an ATM, self service shopping machines and purchasing items using contactless features and cash.

Students also develop their creative skills by using ICT to create animations, simple computer games and short films.



SFI ICT

The main focus is for students to learn to use ICT safely to support them becoming independent adults. Students learn to use technology safely as a tool to communicate with peers and to create functional documents with support and work towards a BTEC qualification. Students also learn to use technology to support learning across the curriculum and to complete research. SFI are aware that our students are potentially more vulnerable and more at risk than others when using ICT and communication devices. Although use the internet/devices is educational and can be creative, empowering and fun it can leave those who are vulnerable to e-safety risks. These are challenging and complex issues that SFI has strategies for, in order to develop safer internet use.
